Abram was around 80 years old when God told him he would have a son.




And He brought him outside and said, "Look now toward the heavens and number the stars—if you are able to count them." Genesis 15:5

Then God told Abram that he would have many children, like the number of the stars in the heavens.




And he believed in the LORD. And He accounted it to him for righteousness. Genesis 15:6

We believe that when scriptures are properly put together, this promise was given to Abram at the beginning of what is Passover Day today.





...as the sun was going down, that a deep sleep fell upon Abram. And, behold, a horror of great darkness fell upon him! Genesis 15:12


This was about the same time of day that Jesus was put into the tomb after he was crucified.





Her Father answered and said, "Let's just read it and find out what happened. We will start reading in the first chapter of the book of Exodus."






An Israelite woman made an ark of reeds, put her son in it and laid it among the reeds at the river's edge. His sister, Miriam, watched to see what would happen.

Exodus 2:1-4




And the child grew, and she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and he became her son. And she called his name Moses. And she said, "Because I took him out of the water."



Moses was 40 years old at that time. Acts 7:23








After a long time the king of Egypt died and the Israelites cried out to God because of the cruel slavery. God remembered his covenant with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.








And God said to Moses, "...Thus you shall say to the children of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you.'" Exodus 3:14

Moses prayed to the LORD saying, "...For since I came to Pharaoh to speak in Your name, he has done evil to this people. Neither have You delivered Your people at all."





Moses was 80 years old and Aaron was 83 when they talked to Pharaoh.





Pharaoh called for Moses to ask the LORD to take away the frogs and he would let the people go. Moses told him to choose when to get rid of the frogs and Pharaoh said, "Tomorrow." And Moses said, "It shall be according to your word so that you may know that there is none like the LORD our God." Exodus 8:8-10




Moses asked the LORD to take the frogs away and the frogs died. They made big piles of the dead frogs and the land stank. Pharaoh hardened his heart and would not let the people go. Exodus 8:12-15





Exodus 8:16-19





Exodus 8:20 thru 9:12





Pharaoh told Moses to leave or he would kill him. Moses said to him, "You will see me no more. The LORD has said that at midnight He will kill all the firstborn of man and beast in Egypt. Then you will let my people go," and then Moses left in great anger.





"...And none of you shall go out of the door of his house until sunrise..." Exodus 12:22



The Israelites took their bread dough before it was leavened. They also took from the Egyptians: jewels, silver, gold and clothes. God caused the Egyptians to give much of what they had to the Children of Israel.







Dad said, "Let us read in the New Testament about Jesus and how He became our Passover Lamb. We will also see how God's people are to keep the Passover today."




Jesus told His disciples that it was two days until the Passover when He would be crucified. The Jewish leaders got together to plan how they could take Jesus and kill Him. They did not want to do it on a Feast Day because they were afraid the people would riot. Matthew 26:1-5



Judas Iscariot, a disciple of Jesus, went to the chief priests to see what they would pay him to deliver up Jesus. They agreed to 30 pieces of silver (The price of a dead slave. Ex. 21:32). After that, Judas sought to betray Jesus.

Now on the first of the unleaveneds, the disciples came to Jesus, saying to Him, "Where do You desire that we prepare for You to eat the Passover?" And He said, "Go into the city to such a man, and say to him, 'The Teacher says, "My time is near; I will keep the Passover with My disciples at your house." ' "

Matthew 26:17-18




They obeyed as Jesus had said and the master of the house showed them an upper room that was furnished. There they prepared the Passover.


And during supper Jesus rose, laid aside His robe, took a towel, poured water in a basin and then washed the disciple's feet. John 13:2-12







Then the band and the chief captain and the officers of the Jews took hold of Jesus, and bound Him; John 18:12


But all this has happened so that the Scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled." Then all the disciples forsook Him and fled. Matthew 26:56






Early in the morning, they took counsel against Jesus to put him to death: They led him to Pontius Pilate the governor, but went not into the judgment hall, lest they be defiled and not be able to eat their Passover. Pilate came out to them and said, "What do you accuse this man of?" They answered, "If He were not an evildoer, we would not have delivered Him up to you." John 18:28-30, Matthew 27:1-2



Now when Judas, who had betrayed Him, saw that He was condemned, he changed his mind and returned the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and the elders, saying, "I have sinned and have betrayed innocent blood." But they said, "What is that to us? You see to it yourself." And after throwing down the pieces of silver in the temple, he went out and hanged himself. Matthew 27:3-5





But they all shouted again, saying, "Not this one, but Barabbas." Now Barabbas was a robber. John 18:40


Pilate said to them, "What then shall I do with Jesus Who is called Christ?" They all said to him, "Let Him be crucified!" Matthew 27:22


So Pilate, willing to do whatever would satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas to them... Mark 15:15




And when they had crucified Him, they divided His garments by casting lots... Matthew 27:35





(How the cross of Jesus may have looked with the title on it.)




Passover services should be kept in the evening, at the beginning of the 14th day of Abib, by the baptized believers of Jesus the Christ.





After singing a hymn, the Passover Service is ended with a prayer.


And after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. Matthew 26:30



For the **promise** to Abraham, or to his seed, that he should be heir of the world, was not given through law; rather, it was through the righteousness of **faith**;


